The Tally Sticks© Constitution: Founding Principles for Transparent Governance

Preamble

Inspired by the historical significance of tally sticks as symbols of trust and accountability, and driven by the need for greater transparency and efficiency in public institutions, this Constitution establishes the foundational principles for the Tally Stick system. This system seeks to empower citizens, promote ethical conduct, and restore faith in the governance of the United Kingdom.

- Public Consultation: The proposed amendment will be subject to a public consultation period, allowing all stakeholders to provide feedback and express their views.
